CMEC Staff Expands

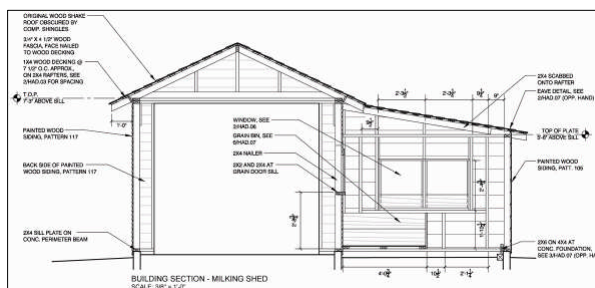
